

A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

As Teen Challenge Canada enters our 50th year of operation, we are celebrating the amazing impact that the Lord has made in the lives of so many individuals and families who have suffered in addiction. I have been with Teen Challenge for 17 years, and I have observed the ministry evolve dramatically over those years and witnessed God's hand at work every step of the way!

In the last decade, we've seen an explosion in the availability of deadly manufactured drugs. Crystal meth, fentanyl, and even prescription drugs are now often the drug of choice. We've had to adapt and make changes to our treatment plans, addiction counselling methods, and more. However these changes and additions to our program, have not changed the spiritual emphasis at the heart of our ministry; we believe God is the catalyst for change, which allows individuals to experience true, long-lasting freedom from drug and alcohol addiction.

Approaches for dealing with addiction are varied, from safe injection, drug replacement to extensive counselling and therapies, and each has its place. Teen Challenge Canada's approach supports men and women seeking a permanent end to abusing drugs and alcohol, through our intensive, 12-month, faith-based program.

To continue assisting men and women across Canada, on their journeys to sobriety,
Teen Challenge Canada has experienced a considerable period of growth — allowing for the
addition of three new facilities and the expansion of two existing locations, for a total of nine
centres with a combined 226 donor-funded long-term beds. Our greater size helps further our
goal of helping those in addiction build a life free from drugs and alcohol, knowing that total
abstinence from substances can transform families and communities.

I am grateful to work with a dedicated National Board and alongside a committed Senior Leadership Team, as we reflect upon our past 50 years of recovery service and envision a future of even greater impact for Teen Challenge Canada.

STATE OF ADDICTION IN CANADA

Did you know? Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid 50 times stronger than heroin. Its potency is such that a piece the size of a grain of sand can cause an overdose. So, it's no surprise that 76% of all drug overdoses across Canada, in the first six months of 2022, involved Fentanyl¹. Indeed, Fentanyl has dramatically increased substance abuse overdose deaths, killing thousands of Canadians every year.

With the increased risk of overdose, Teen Challenge Canada is working to create more access to our program and rehabilitation services for Canadians across all regions.

To help facilitate this ambitious goal, we opened a brand-new centre in Eastern Ontario (Renfrew, ON) in 2022. We also began laying the groundwork for a strategically placed community office in Sudbury, ON. This addiction recovery office will connect social services, local non-profits, and Teen Challenge Canada to those who need it most, in hopes of building easily accessible pathways between our life-saving program and available services.

Teen Challenge stands alongside other non-profits, ministries, and government agencies in the fight against addiction.

The severity of the Canadian drug crisis, driven by Fentanyl, highlights the vital work of Teen Challenge Canada. Across the country, we are positively impacting the lives of those struggling with addiction through our 12-month, faith-based, in-residence program. Because of Teen Challenge Canada, lives are being transformed, families are being restored, and communities are being strengthened. "In the first six months of 2022, approximately 20 Canadians died every day from drug overdose"," said Glen Smeltzer, CEO, Teen Challenge Canada. "It's these tragedies that drive Teen Challenge to stand alongside other non-profits, ministries, and government agencies in the fight against addiction."

HOW WE SUPPORT THOSE WHO COME SEEKING HELP AT A TEEN CHALLENGE CANADA CENTRE

It is no secret that the media has begun to report on the gaps that are present in how Canada's medical community manages the current addiction crisis. With long waitlists and high entrance costs, it can be extremely difficult for individuals who need help to find it – especially when these people are desperate for help.

The Saskatchewan Health Authority reports the average inpatient treatment program is 28 days long. For many, this is not enough time in program to receive the treatment required to overcome substance abuse. Dr. Peter Butt, Chair of the Medical Section with Saskatchewan Medical Association states, "Individuals require over 12-months to be considered in sustained remission from addiction."

At Teen Challenge Canada, we know that the path to recovery is hard and time-consuming. Therefore, to support those who come to us seeking freedom from addiction, we offer individualized treatment programs through our 12-month, three-phase core program. From the moment a client steps through a Teen Challenge Canada centre door, they are surrounded by love, understanding, and support. Our yearlong program provides individuals with an accredited addiction counsellor who can help guide them through their recovery and teach them how to adapt to structure and overcome their addiction. Additional aspects of our program focus on community engagement, spiritual formation, work therapy, and leadership development – all of these aspects help provide the tools individuals will need to lead a productive life after they graduate the program. Individuals who choose to deepen their recovery after graduation, as part of our after-care program, may choose to work alongside Teen Challenge Canada staff as part of our Phase4 & Phase5 programs.

Furthermore, individuals seeking treatment may have to overcome financial barriers to treatment. Many programs cost thousands of dollars and for those who have alienated relationships and support systems, finding funds to cover the high cost of private treatment




is not attainable. At Teen Challenge Canada, because of our supportive donors, participants are <u>only</u> required to pay a one-time fee of \$1100 to receive a yearlong, in-residence program – this cost-effective treatment option provides critical care that is accessible. And at no time is anyone turned away due to financial burdens.

The economical, 12-month, in-residence program, offered by Teen Challenge Canada allows men and women in our care, time to learn to face their past, and embrace a new life. They respond to life-giving words and transforming prayers as they embrace God's truth about themselves. Through community with others in recovery, they learn to care and be cared for again. Serving each other and volunteering in the community reignites a desire to work and contribute. Then when ready, they return to their families, friends, and communities ready to make a difference and live a life free from addiction.












DISTRIBUTION OF GIVING INCOME

ADDITIONAL POINTS

- "Community Engagement" is our on-the-ground, community-focused programming, which includes pre-admission counselling, family support, graduate aftercare, Celebrate Recovery support groups, and other addiction awareness events.
- Client fees (\$1,100 per person) fund 2% of the overall cost of their yearlong program.
- The average monthly cost of a program bed is \$4,600 (incl. fundraising and admin).
- Teen Challenge Canada receives no ongoing government funding and is completely funded by donations.
- We keep our admin costs low (4.5%) by centralizing admissions, call centre, advertising, marketing activities, and event support for all our centres.

We are so grateful for your continued support as we care for more men and women at our centres and help strengthen more Canadian communities. Canada's addiction crisis is touching countless lives. Your financial gifts enable Teen Challenge Canada's life-changing message of recovery and freedom to reach as many individuals as possible, every day.

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SUPPORTING OUR LIFE-CHANGING WORK

With approximately 500 people directly attending services from Sunday to Sunday, Richmond Hill Pentecostal Church, located in Richmond Hill, ON, is thriving in the community. "The church has been supporting the Ontario Women's Centre in Aurora since 2008," says Pastor William Sloos. In addition to taking up financial offerings to help the Centre meet expenses, many church members also volunteer their time or are employed with Teen Challenge Canada.

"As a pastor, I've held chapel services for the Ontario Women's Centre and been on-site to support their ministries. It's not just about financial support, I think there's a real deep connection between our church and the local women's centre." Every year, the Ontario Women's Centre attends a Sunday service at the Pentecostal Church in Richmond Hill. They express their faith and testimonies through various styles of worship and musical expression.

The goal is not only to spread the message about the Teen Challenge Canada ministry, and what it has to offer, but also to raise awareness and inspire people to seek help for their loved ones struggling with addiction.

"There are always people in our church who are either struggling with or they know someone

dealing with either an alcohol or drug addiction," adds Pastor Sloos, "I think people have come to the church dealing with addictions, and in the past, a lot of times the message they received in church is just 'pray about it; it'll go away'. I'm thankful that churches all around, including ours, have become more vocal about the challenges of addictions. It's not something that you can simply 'pray away.' It's something that we need to provide whatever resources we can, to support somebody in getting free from substance abuse."

"So many graduates of the [Teen Challenge Canada] program have come back into our church and have served and supported others in their desire for freedom," says Pastor Sloos, "These people have done such a great

WHAT ARE THE SIGNS OF ADDICTION?

According to a report published by Health Canada, toxic street drugs including fentanyl, killed nearly 20 Canadians per day in the first six months of 2022¹. The fear of losing someone to addiction is in the hearts and minds of many Canadians. Determining whether someone you love has an issue with addiction and needs help, can be very difficult.

Addiction is clinically referred to as a 'substance use disorder' and is a complex need of the brain and body that involves the compulsive use of one or more substances despite serious health and social consequences.

The signs of addiction are not always easy to recognize. Some people may not even be aware that they are struggling with drug addiction or alcoholism. The signs of addiction may include changes in weight, insomnia, mood swings or depression. However, the most common sign of addiction is the inability to stop using harmful substances despite knowing the negative consequences of use.

In 2020, Sandra bravely sought treatment at a Teen Challenge Canada Women's Centre, where she learned to rely on God instead of alcohol. "I used to drink until I passed out to forget about my problems." Now Sandra asks God, "What are you teaching me? How do you want me to handle this situation?" On hard days she practices self-care by "going for walks, watching a movie, or singing."

At the Teen Challenge Prairie Hope Women's Centre (Hague, SK), Sandra revived her natural organizational abilities and learned to cook. "I like to make spaghetti and meatballs," says Sandra, who lives in mature student housing at Bible college. To deepen her recovery, Sandra, as a Teen Challenge graduate, completed the Phase4 program and helped other women in recovery at Teen Challenge Canada. "In Phase4, I continued to access addiction counselling while building my leadership skills." Now in her second year of Bible college in Saskatchewan, Sandra leads two Christian small groups and is on the college's events committee.

Sandra acknowledges the importance of a supportive community in maintaining sobriety. She lived with another Teen Challenge Canada graduate in her first year at Bible College and she continues to connect with Teen Challenge mentors and friends. In addition, her parents are a vital source of support. "I am thankful they never gave up on me." Sandra has some tips for graduates who are returning to their communities. She says, "Always turn to God and your support system for help, and don't forget to keep doing what you learned in the program – and remember, recovery is a lifelong process!".

GRADUATES ARE KEY PLAYERS WITHIN OUR STAFF ACROSS CANADA

Upon graduation from the Teen Challenge Canada 12-month, three-phase program, graduates may have the opportunity to continue their journey with Teen Challenge Canada through Phase4 and Phase5 graduate programs. About 25% of our staff members across Canada are graduates, making them key players in our ministry.

From centre directors, to front-line staff, to regional development team members, graduates are inspiring and encouraging all those who enter our program. Our graduates represent a significant part of our ministry and are the reason why many individuals, start or continue their own journeys to sobriety through the Teen Challenge Canada program. "Our graduates have real-life personal experience. This gives them credibility with men and women in the program," says

Matthew Holmes, is a CSW Supervisor and has been a staff member for over a year, working directly with clients to ensure they're getting the hands-on support they need. Having graduated from the program in 2018, Matthew continued on to get his Bachelor of Theology and worked in his field before being called back to work for Teen Challenge Canada. "I felt like it was God's will for me to come back," says Matthew.

Dean Crawford graduated from the program in 2009. After working with Teen Challenge for several years and then at a variety of executive positions across Newfoundland, Dean rejoined the staff of Teen Challenge Canada in 2021 as a Development Officer. "I just said to my wife, Teen Challenge is the only work that ever gave me a sense that I was doing something meaningful and worthwhile."

Teen Challenge graduates are a living legacy that demonstrates the power of God to transform those in addiction. Graduates bring healing and hope to their families and communities, and we are grateful to train, mentor, and empower these inspiring individuals to lead full and productive lives.

ROAD TO RECOVERY

CORE PROGRAM

PHASE1 (MONTHS 1-4)

Men and women stabilize as they detoxify their minds, bodies, and spirits. An Accredited Addiction Counsellor helps clients create a treatment plan and work through emotions and personal trauma. During this phase, clients learn to adapt to structure, live and work with others, and cope with their pain caused by addiction – unfortunately, due to the challenging nature of this work, only about half of our clients choose to continue to the next phase.

PHASE2 (MONTHS 5-8)

Clients continue to learn about themselves and the Bible. They continue to create healthy routines, hone employment skills, volunteer in the community, and share their recovery stories at churches and businesses.

PHASE3 (MONTHS 9-12)

During the final four months of our core program, clients create an exit strategy and a relapse prevention plan. They develop leadership skills, mature in their faith, and where possible, improve family relationships.

AFTERCARE PROGRAM (POST GRADUATE)

PHASE4 (MONTHS 12-24)

If a position is available, graduates can choose to stay at a Teen Challenge centre for an additional 6 months to 1 year. They work alongside staff and current core program clients while continuing in a mentoring relationship with a counsellor and staff members.

PHASE5 (MONTHS 24-36)

If a position is available after a successful completion of a Phase4 Program, Phase5 graduates are hired in a staff position supporting a local Teen Challenge Canada centre. They join a church, attend Celebrate Recovery meetings, and begin to give back to society.

* Aftercare Assistance is provided to all graduates to support them in their hard-won recoveries. Graduates are connected with our National Aftercare Coordinator to ensure successful reintegration into society.

GET HELP TODAY!

Over the last two years, the Canadian Government reported a 91% increase in opioid toxicity deaths in Canada. Likewise, the Canadian Mental Health Association continues to report that 1 in 5 Canadians will meet the criteria for addiction in their lifetime, and the rise in mental health issues, stemming from the pandemic, has further fueled the addiction crisis in Canada.

Many in addiction describe 'needing' drugs and alcohol 'just to feel normal' and how drugs and alcohol slowly took over every aspect of their lives. At Teen Challenge Canada we know that addiction gradually ruins everything that is good in someone's life – family, friends, work, and hobbies become collateral damage. When someone in pain finally says "no more" to addiction, we are ready to respond with local treatment beds available across the country. Teen Challenge Canada is there for those who need help.

With nine centres across the country, united under one ministry, the Teen Challenge Canada program offers individuals an opportunity to find help, hope, and freedom from life-controlling personal addictions.

Within our core faith-based, 12-month, in-residence program, men and women make the life changes necessary to live a life free from substance abuse. We provide aftercare resources — crucial support after graduation to reduce the dangers of returning to substance use, during the difficult adjustment period following treatment. For those who need to further deepen their recovery, there are opportunities for graduates to spend an additional 6 to 24 months in-residence at a Teen Challenge Canada centre, working alongside staff as part of our Phase4 and Phase5 programs.

Addiction doesn't happen overnight, and neither does real change. For those struggling with personal addiction, the fear, shame, and guilt can pile up – but there is hope! At a Teen Challenge Canada centre you will not be alone on your journey to recovery. Our compassionate staff will help you overcome obstacles, celebrate your individual successes, and support you as you return restored to your family and community. It will be hard work, but for those who want help overcoming their addictions, the Teen Challenge Canada ministry is here when someone is ready to take their first brave steps to recovery!

FAITH IS ESSENTIAL TO RECOVERY

The Teen Challenge Canada program builds on Christian principles, which provide a unique perspective when working with those in addiction. Our approach emphasizes the power of faith in overcoming addiction and encourages long-term sobriety.

Faith is a central part of the Teen Challenge program; as Zach Drew, Director of the Saskatchewan Men's Centre explains, "The themes of redemption, forgiveness, and second chances are essential for individuals struggling with addiction to hear. As a graduate of the Teen Challenge program, I can personally attest to this."

While faith is a significant aspect of the Teen Challenge Canada experience, clients are not required to adhere to a specific faith tradition to participate in our program. Instead, we ask that they come with a willingness to learn and to engage with the program. Robyn Arcand, Director of the Prairie Hope Women's Centre adds, "A Teen Challenge Canada Centre provides men and women with a sanctuary and the opportunity to heal through our faith-based program. The journey will be challenging, but staff and volunteers are here to support those willing to try the Teen Challenge approach."

Teah Bailey, aka 'One8tea', wrote his first song in Grade 6. "I was a kid with a foul mouth who loved music." These days he raps and leads workshops about faith, bullying, teen suicide, and drug awareness. Teah acknowledges, "God the maker of the sun, moon, and stars" as the giver of his "good gift."

Teah is an award-winning Canadian hip-hop artist and the founder of One8tea Ministries. Most recently, he won the East Coast Music Awards Rap/Hip Hop Recording of the Year for his 2022 album, Ventilation 2, 2022 Rap Artist of the Year, and 2022 Music NB Song of the Year, for "I Guess It's Complicated". Teah is also a 3-time Covenant Award winner and NB Gospel Music Hall of Fame 2022 inductee.


Teah graduated from the Teen Challenge Atlantic Men's Centre (Memramcook, NB) in September 2011. Before entering recovery, Teah was on a "destructive path" that included stealing cars, abusing cocaine, belonging to a gang, and homelessness. His family insisted, "Get your life together!" But it wasn't until he saw the dramatic change his friend Ricky experienced at Teen Challenge, that Teah was convinced to go and get help.

Teah appreciated the structure of the Teen Challenge program, and how it instills the importance of healthy routines. "The program helps you create a new default system." He says, "Men and women experiencing addiction use substances to deal with pain at Teen Challenge you learn to truly live and function without drugs."

Living in community at the Atlantic Men's Centre taught him the value of close friends. To maintain his sobriety, Teah is careful to always be open with trustworthy friends. "There are five of us. That's my circle - the people I do life with." He knows he can rely on these guys, even in the middle of the night.

With his wife Tasha, Teah has three children and a 2-year-old granddaughter. "I'm a rapping grandpa." The former drug seller describes himself as the "neighbourhood hope dealer." He tells people living on the street, "God can liberate them from addiction and change their lives." Teah is flesh and blood proof it's possible to experience life change and freedom from substance abuse! In a song called, "Trauma Remix", Teah raps, "I gotta message that'll save vour life. ..."
